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Course description:	The subject criminal law II (special part), aims to provide opportunities for students to gain knowledge from the special part of criminal law. Students will be encouraged to be active participants in lectures through presentations or seminar papers.			
Purpose of the course:	The purpose of the course is to provide students with sufficient knowledge of the structure of criminal offenses. Also, this course aims to analyze the criminal offenses, identifying the characteristics of criminal offenses, the simple forms and qualified forms of criminal offenses. By defining and analyzing criminal offenses it is possible to apply the principle of criminal offenses by law, and so students understand what actions are defined as criminal offenses.			
Learning outcomes:	Upon the completion of the course students will be able to: - formulate the concept of Criminal Law (special part) and to recognize the structure of criminal offenses individually; - be able to distinguish the figures of criminal offenses; - understand the role and importance of Criminal Law II in the study of concepts that consist in the application of the principle of legality and the prevention of crime.
