Criminalistics is divided into three parts: Criminalistics Techniques, Criminalistics Tactics and Criminalistics Methodology.

Through the treatment of criminalistic techniques and crimialistic methodology, students are enabled to understand the basic concepts of criminalistics and identify the techniques and scientific methods used in the detection and clarification of crime.
