Course description:	The subject Real Property includes the analytical review of property rights and other real rights (Property, easements, mortgages, pledges, construction rights and real encumbrances). This course will focus on examining the fundamental issues of property rights such as the meaning (content) of ownership, the acquisition (creation) of ownership, transactions (transfer) with property rights, limitations of property rights and the extinction of property rights. ownership. Other property rights will also be considered because they are necessarily related to the rigat of ownership, while the consideration insofar as it is in the interest of the course for property rights to be treated in the perspective of commercial transactions. This course aims to gain basic knowledge of property rights and ther property rights.

Study-simulation cases: during the course students will have practical work which will be in the form of study cases held in the classroom. Students will also be charged with case studies which must be done as homework and brought to the professor at the required time. Case studies consist of written case studies from practice and assigning students to resolve such a case in accordance with legal provisions. Case simulation is a practical form through which students are trained in practical exercises by simulating cases and taking on the role of parties and other bodies in property disputes.
